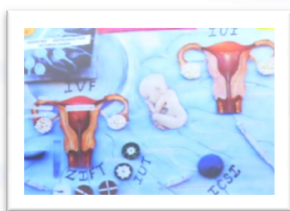

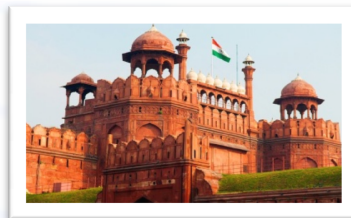


TOURIST ATTRACTIONS



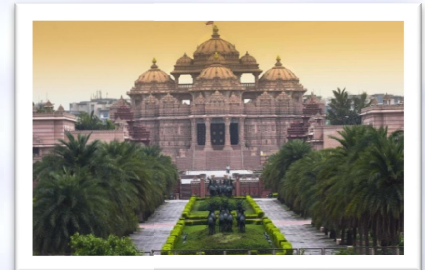
The Golden temple is located in the holy city Amritsar. The Golden temple is famous for its full golden dome, it is one of the most sacred pilgrim spots. Maharaja Ranjit Singh had the upper half of the building built with approximately 400 kg of gold leaf.

The Taj Mahal is an ivory-white marble mausoleum on the south bank of the Yamuna River in Agra. The Taj Mahal was designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1983 for being “the jewel of Muslim art in India and one of the universally admired masterpieces of the world’s heritage”.



Red Fort, in Old Delhi was built by Shah and remains a major tourist attraction. The fort was designated a UNESCO World Heritage site in 2007. India’s Prime Minister hoists the National Flag from the ramparts of the Red Fort each year on Independence Day.

Akshardham is a Hindu temple, a spiritual complex constructed in East Delhi in the year 2005. The term ‘Akshardham’ is the combination of two words ‘Akshar’ means ‘eternal’ and ‘Dham’ means ‘abode’. On a whole, it actually means the abode of eternal values, virtues and principles which are mentioned in Vedas and Puranas of Hindu mythology.



The National War Memorial represents the gratitude of a nation to its Armed Forces. Since-Independence, more than 26,000 soldiers of the Indian Armed Forces have made the supreme sacrifice to defend the sovereignty and integrity of the country. It is built in the central vistas near India Gate which can be seen in the backdrop of the photograph.



The Qutub Minar is a minaret and "victory tower" which lies at the site of Delhi's oldest fortified city, Lal Kot, founded by the Tomar Rajputs. It consists of 399 steps. It is a UNESCO World Heritage Site in the Mehrauli area of South Delhi, India. It is one of the most visited tourist spots in the city, mostly built between 1199 and 1220.
